Whether newly diagnosed or multi-year HIV survivor, living with HIV/AIDS can be confusing and involve a wide variety of issues.

Together, HIV+ clients and Case Manager's plan and coordinated with the appropriate services and resources that might be needed to achieve a healthier life.

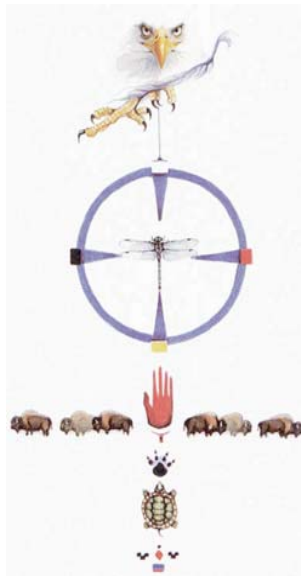
Culturally sensitive and confidential support is offered individually and/or as a group through different activities, such as client retreats, crafts and educational sessions.

IPTF Case Management services increase and sustain emotional well being, provide psychological and emotional support and social networking opportunities. These opportunities include talking circles, attending Midewiwin and Sundance Ceremonies, language activities and traditional feasts which help to reduce social isolation, stigma and promote general well being.



A Case Manager May help you:

- Coordination of Health Care needs;
- Facilitate referrals to appropriate agencies
- Monitor the quality of any service you receive.
- Answer questions that you, your family, friends and partners may have about HIV and related issues
- Information and referrals to vocational training and/or placement.
- Assistance with Transportation
- Access to traditional/spiritual counseling

Assistance to clients may include:

- Locating a suitable doctor who is knowledgeable about the treatment of HIV/AIDS
- Access to health insurance
- Help with obtaining financial assistance.
- Locating resources for affordable and appropriate housing.
- Education and support for family and friends
- Information about reducing the risk of transmitting the virus or becoming re-infected
- Securing legal counsel
- Assisting in filling out forms/paperwork
- Referrals to traditional/spiritual counseling
